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What Is the Canadian Citizenship Test?

The Canadian citizenship test is based on the official **Discover Canada** study guide published by Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC).

The test is designed to confirm that applicants have a basic understanding of Canada before becoming citizens.

Test Format

The official citizenship test includes:

- **20 questions**
- Multiple-choice and True/False questions
- **30-minute time limit**
- Pass mark: **15 correct answers out of 20 (75%)**

Questions are selected from topics covered in the Discover Canada guide.

Topics Covered

During the test you may be asked questions about:

CA Canadian History

Important historical events, Indigenous Peoples, Confederation, and key people who helped shape Canada.

Government

Canada's parliamentary democracy, constitutional monarchy, federal, provincial and municipal governments, elections, and the justice system.

Sn Rights and Responsibilities

Rights protected by Canadian law and the responsibilities expected of Canadian citizens.

● Geography

Canadian provinces and territories, capitals, major cities, regions, rivers, mountains, and climate.

★ Canadian Symbols

The Canadian flag, national anthem, coat of arms, maple leaf, beaver, hockey, and other national symbols.

Before Your Test Day

A few days before your test:

- ✓ Read the Discover Canada guide again.
- ✓ Complete several practice tests.
- ✓ Prepare your identification documents.
- ✓ Review your invitation carefully.
- ✓ Plan your route to the testing location or ensure your online testing equipment is ready if you have an online test.

What Should You Bring?

Depending on the instructions in your invitation, you may need to bring:

- Your citizenship test invitation
- Permanent Resident Card (if applicable)
- Passports and travel documents
- Government-issued photo identification
- Any additional documents requested by IRCC

Always follow the instructions provided in your official invitation.

Arriving for the Test

If your test is in person:

- Arrive at least **30 minutes early**.
- Turn off your phone before entering the testing area.
- Follow all instructions provided by IRCC staff.
- Be prepared to wait if several applicants are scheduled at the same time.

The Interview

Many applicants will also have a brief interview with a citizenship officer.

During the interview, the officer may:

- Verify your identity
- Review your documents
- Confirm your travel history
- Ask about your addresses
- Review your citizenship application

The interview is usually straightforward if your application is complete and accurate.

During the Test

Take your time.

Read every question carefully before choosing an answer.

If you are unsure, eliminate answers that are clearly incorrect and select the best remaining option.

Remember:

- Answer every question.
- Manage your time wisely.
- Stay calm and focused.

After the Test

After completing the test:

- IRCC will continue processing your application.
- If additional information is required, IRCC will contact you.
- If all requirements are met, you will receive an invitation to attend the Canadian Citizenship Ceremony and take the Oath of Citizenship.

What If You Don't Pass?

Not everyone passes on the first attempt.

If you do not achieve the required score, IRCC will explain the next steps based on your situation. This may include another opportunity to demonstrate your knowledge or additional follow-up as outlined by IRCC.

Many successful Canadian citizens passed after taking extra time to prepare.

Tips to Increase Your Chances of Passing

- Read the Discover Canada guide at least two or three times.
 - Practice with realistic mock exams.
 - Study a little every day instead of cramming.
 - Get enough sleep the night before your test.
 - Arrive early and stay relaxed.
 - Read each question carefully before answering.

Practice tests help you:

- Become familiar with the real exam format.
- Identify topics that need more study.
- Build confidence before test day.
- Improve your speed and accuracy.

The more you practice, the more prepared you will feel.
