Everything You Should Do Before Leaving Home

Introduction

Your Canadian citizenship test is one of the final steps toward becoming a Canadian citizen. A little preparation before test day can help you feel more confident and avoid unnecessary stress.

Use this checklist to make sure you're fully prepared.

■ Before Test Day

Read the Discover Canada Guide

Review the official **Discover Canada** study guide several times. Make sure you understand the key topics, including:

- Canadian history
- Government
- Geography
- Rights and responsibilities
- Elections
- National symbols
- Economy

Complete Practice Tests

Practice with realistic mock exams until you consistently score **75% or higher**.

The more questions you answer, the more confident you'll become.

Get a Good Night's Sleep

Try to sleep at least **7–8 hours** the night before your test.

A well-rested mind helps you concentrate and remember information more effectively.

Eat Before the Test

Have a healthy meal before leaving home.

Avoid arriving hungry, as it may make it harder to concentrate during the exam.

) Documents Checklist

Bring the documents requested in your invitation. Depending on your situation, this may include:

- ☐ Citizenship test invitation
- ☐ Permanent Resident Card (if applicable)
- ☐ Passports and travel documents
- ☐ Government-issued photo identification
- ☐ Any additional documents requested by IRCC

Always follow the instructions in your official invitation.

Arrive Early

Plan to arrive at least **30 minutes before** your scheduled appointment.

This gives you enough time to:

- Check in
- Complete any required procedures
- Relax before the test begins

Turn Off Your Phone

Before entering the testing room:

- ✓ Turn off your phone or place it on silent if instructed.
- ✓ Follow all instructions provided by IRCC staff.

During the Test

Remember these simple tips:

- Read every question carefully.
- Don't rush.
- Answer every question.
- Stay calm.

If you're unsure of an answer, eliminate the choices you know are incorrect and make your best selection.

During the Interview

Many applicants will also have a short interview with a citizenship officer.

Be prepared to answer questions about:

- Your identity
- Your travel history
- Your addresses
- Your employment or studies
- Information in your citizenship application

Answer honestly and clearly.

Manage Your Time

You have **30 minutes** to complete **20 questions**.

Most applicants finish with time to review their answers.

If you don't know an answer immediately, move on and return to it later if time allows.

Stay Positive

Feeling a little nervous is normal.

Remember:

- You have prepared.
- You have practiced.
- You know more than you think.

Take a deep breath, read carefully, and do your best.

★ Quick Test Day Checklist

- ✓ Complete several practice tests.
- ✓ Sleep well.
- ✓ Eat before leaving home.
- ✓ Bring the required documents.
- ✓ Arrive early.
- ✓ Stay calm.
- ✓ Read every question carefully.
- ✓ Answer all 20 questions.
