Elections

 - Secret ballots
 - Electoral districts
 - Members of Parliament
 - Why voting is important in a democracy
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Rights and Responsibilities

Every Canadian citizen enjoys important rights and also has responsibilities.

Examples include:

Rights

- Freedom of expression
- Freedom of religion
- Equality before the law
- Democratic rights
- Mobility rights

Responsibilities

- Obey the law
- Vote in elections
- Serve on a jury when called
- Help protect Canada's environment and heritage
- Respect the rights of others

● Geography

Know Canada's geography, including:

- Ten provinces
- Three territories
- Provincial and territorial capitals
- Three oceans:
 - Atlantic
 - Pacific
 - Arctic
- Major mountain ranges
- Rivers and lakes
- Climate and natural regions

Understanding where places are located can help you answer geography questions more confidently.

¡A+ Economy

The guide introduces Canada's economy and the importance of different industries.

You should recognize examples such as:

- Agriculture
- Forestry
- Mining
- Manufacturing
- Technology
- Tourism
- Financial services

You don't need to memorize detailed economic statistics.

Canadian Symbols

Be familiar with important national symbols, including:

- The Canadian Flag
- The Maple Leaf
- The National Anthem
- The Beaver
- The Crown
- Hockey
- Lacrosse
- The Coat of Arms

These symbols reflect Canada's history and identity.

Canada's Diversity

Canada is known for welcoming people from many cultures and backgrounds.

Diversity strengthens communities while Canadians share common values such as:

- Respect
- Equality
- Democracy
- Freedom
- Rule of law
